Curriculum Advisor Position Available

Volunteers can work one-on-one with top undergraduate scholars from Turkmenistan

As part of its mission to develop and encourage civic values, international experience, and community engagement, the Turkmenistan Youth and Civic Values Foundation is now seeking **Curriculum Advisors**. Curriculum Advisors are motivated individuals who create and teach a semester or year-long course to top undergraduate students from Turkmenistan.

Curriculum Advisors are the volunteer backbone of the Foundation Curriculum, one of the Foundation's five programs. The Foundation Curriculum is a set of required readings and associated written assignments intended for the winners of the Honor Spingarn / Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Scholarship, another Foundation program. The Foundation Curriculum provides a thorough introduction to critical thinking, political and social theory and ideas, leadership and peacemaking.

If you were a social sciences, history, philosophy, literature, or classics major or have an interest in those or other liberal arts, this is a chance to work with bright, inspiring Turkmen students and teach them to think analytically and creatively.

Curriculum Advisors are required to create a course that is either 15 weekly reading assignments with follow-up questions (one semester) or 30 weekly reading assignments with follow-up questions (one year). You work directly with one or more King/Spingarn scholars over e-mail. The Foundation will cover all costs of reading materials, arrange all shipping and will provide a stipend for you to call your scholar.

Currently, the Foundation has five King/Spingarn scholars at various years in their undergraduate education. In the past, they have worked with current Program Director Isaac Scarborough in his year-long course "Topics in Modernism," and with current Executive Director Kenyon Weaver in his year-long courses "Individual and Society" and "Colonialism". Now is the chance for you to work with these talented students to help them become educated adults.
